Public Masses have resumed at St. Brigid's as indicated in the schedule inside this bulletin and on the parish website (saintbrigid.net).

Call the Parish Office (516-334-0021 x 0) to arrange for Baptisms, Weddings and Memorial Masses. Otherwise, all meetings and events (other than virtual) at St. Brigid's Church are canceled until further notice.

The St. Brigid Parish Center at St. Anthony Hall is located at 85 Post Avenue, diagonally across the street from the Church.

Confession

The sacrament of reconciliation is offered in the Church from 4pm to 5pm on Saturdays, and on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays after the 12:10 pm Mass (when there are no holidays).

Visitors are asked to enter the Church by way of the handicapped doors (doors nearest the cemetery) using your elbow to access the automatic door openers. Once inside the Church, those desiring to receive the sacrament are asked to stand on the side aisle standing on the appropriate marks on the aisle that maintain the safe 6 foot distance between penitents.

Due to the Covid 19 restrictions, these hours are subject to change, please check the website for updates.

Sacramental Life of our Parish

Baptism for children (*under the age of 7*) is celebrated in English on the first three Sundays at 1 pm; in Spanish on the last Sunday of the month at 1 pm; in Kreyol on the 3rd Saturday at 1 pm. Parents attend a preparation session on the first Monday of the month from 8 to 9:30 pm in the church. Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) to make arrangements to speak to one of our priests or deacons about your child's upcoming baptism.

Celebration of Marriage

Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) at least six months in advance to make arrangements for an interview with one of our parish deacons or priests who will meet with the engaged couple, set the time and date of the wedding, and make arrangements for our parish marriage preparation program.

Rite of Christian Initiation

Adults who have never been baptized are prepared for the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) through the RCIA process. Other adults may have already been baptized, but are seeking to receive Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Those interested in knowing more about the process of becoming a full member of the Catholic Church are invited to call Sister Ann Horn at 516-334-0021, ext. 353. Parents who have school-aged children who have never been baptized are also invited to speak to Sister Ann about their process of preparation for these sacraments.

Sacraments of School Age Children

Our parish faith formation program prepares children for the celebration of the sacraments of Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation. The norm is that children receive a two-year preparation for Reconciliation and Eucharist (normally celebrated in the second grade) and a two-year preparation program for Confirmation (normally celebrated in the eighth grade). Our religious education program deepens the experience of faith and religious formation in the years between the celebrations of these sacraments.

Parents who have children older than first grade and are seeking to have them receive the sacraments of Eucharist (First Communion), Reconciliation or Confirmation are asked to call the Religious Education office.

Communion to the Sick and Homebound

Anyone who is not able to attend Mass because of frailty, chronic or temporary illness, or admission to hospice can have Holy Communion brought to them at home on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to make arrangements for a lay minister to bring holy communion.

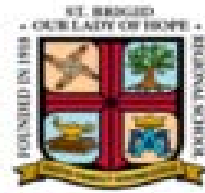

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

February 7th - Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue

Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.

When it was evening, after sunset,

they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him.

Rising very early before dawn, he left

and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.



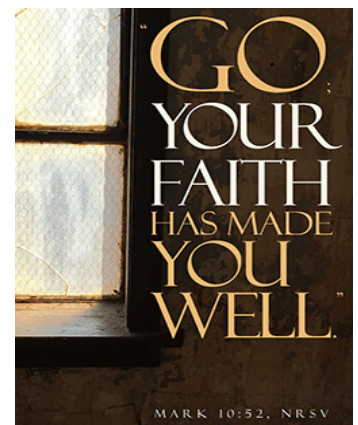
Jesus' message allows us to "get up" and do the things we are called to do, which means to live life as God has called us to do. It's a wake-up call. Our challenge is to open ourselves to the beauty of this life God has given us. Our challenge is to open ourselves to the wonderful way God is continually speaking to us through the most ordinary and human experiences of our lives.

Can things get much worse?

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is February 17th - and, like many things in this Covid Climate, it is challenging to think how ashes can be safely and effectively administered this year. For those who wish to celebrate Mass, we will have three Masses - 7am, 9am and 7:30pm in the evening. Ashes will be distributed after those Masses.

Ashes will also be distributed nonstop after the 9:30am Mass until our 7:30pm Mass. Once again, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and readings will be provided for people who wish to reflect upon their commitment to grow closer to the Lord through this holy season of Lent. For the sake of safety, ashes will be distributed with a q-tip that is disposed after each recipient receives ashes. All recipients as well as all ministers will be masked.

For those who feel uncomfortable in coming to Church to receive ashes, we will have prayer-cards with blessed ashes attached for families who choose not to attend. These prayer-cards with ashes can be picked up at the parish center. Volunteers are needed to help us assemble the prayer cards and small bags of ashes. Volunteers are invited to help me prepare the ashes for the homebound on Saturday, February 6th at 10am in Saint Anthony's Hall.

Imagine the world of Israel in the time of Jesus. While Israel enjoyed some autonomy under Roman rule, there was no doubt as to who was in charge - Tiberius Caesar, Dominus et Divus ("Lord and God" - at least as stamped on the Roman coins). Pilate himself had defiled the holy Temple of God by placing images of the emperor in the holy place. As we read in today's gospel, the scribes, the official teachers of Judaism, did not "teach with authority." Their teaching was the sum of tiresome interpretations of biblical texts from various schools of rabbinical thought. Just reading this last sentence will put you to sleep!

And now, into a holy place, the synagogue, a person with an unclean spirit enters. Unclean spirits were usually manifest in the dark places and the uninhabited wilderness. How utterly incongruous to see a person with an unclean spirit in a synagogue! It just seems that nothing is sacred any more. Nothing is special.

"What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us?" Thus the person with the unclean spirit utters a challenge to the Holy One of God. "You have no place in this synagogue. You have no authority over us!" The gauntlet is laid down for the ultimate battle between good and evil. Who will win?

So, let not the drama persist - we know who wins. Sometimes we watch the drama between the good guys and the bad guys, between good and evil, and it becomes a source of entertainment for us, stimulating that part of us that wants to see a good fight. But Jesus silences the demon, silences the drama of the gauntlet having been laid down. The first round goes to Jesus. By the fifteenth round, the victory is clearly His.

Once in a while, evil will raise its ugly head. Once in a while bigotry, racism, destruction of reputations and property, the unclean spirits that manifest themselves in bullying, name-calling, fear-mongering, lies and deception, and unabashed narcissism will rear its ugly head. But I know who won the war. I refuse to be drawn into the made-for-TV drama that wants to make us all arm-chair spectators and commentators engaged in endless silly debate. I know who won. In Christian optimism, I know without doubt the end of the story.

Yet, our fight against evil, against intolerance and racism, against injustice and the careless discarding of life, is frighteningly real and must continue. But faith in the resurrection of Jesus calls me to turn away from the drama and the useless worry and the spinning of conspiracy theories that bring about faithless pessimism. I know who won!

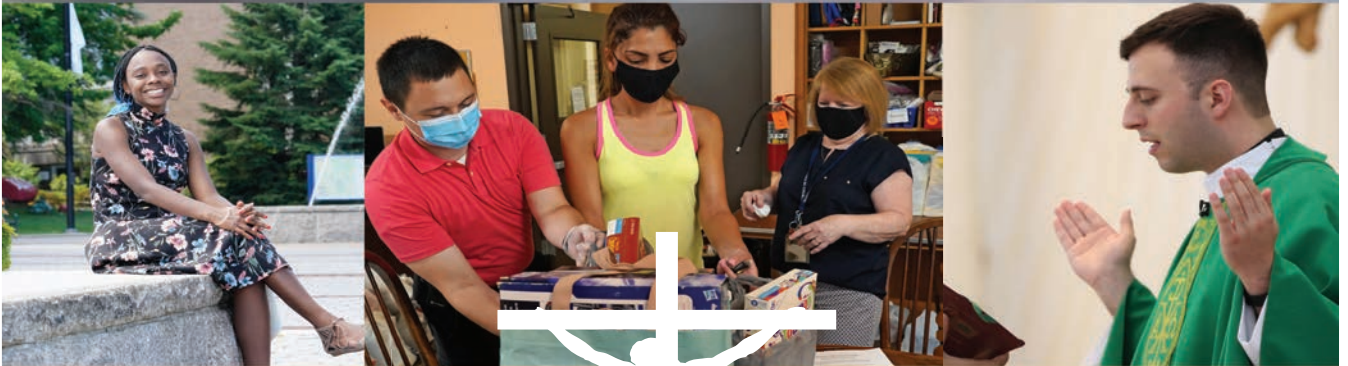

Virtus Update

Background Screening Update FOR ALL PARISH VOLUNTEERS

From The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People, Diocese of Rockville Centre

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

1. Attend **Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)**
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct;
3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5 yr. intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct- provided during the Virtus registration process.
3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application background offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened you may be at – or beyond- the **5yr. rescreening requirement**. If this is the case, you will receive an email from **Sterling Volunteers** asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account.

Please be aware-this is not a scam nor has your e-mail been hacked. The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically resign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account: www.Virtus.org You will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or helpdesk@virtus.org. Once in your account, review your account information-particularly your e-mail address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen in the green column click "Update My Account" You will be able to make the necessary changes-please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.

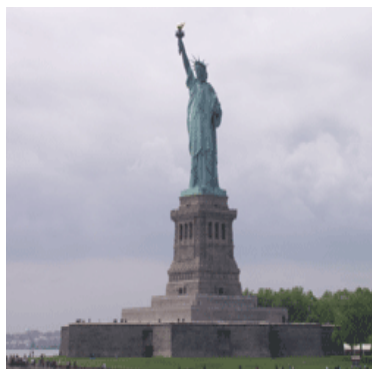

“Los Profetas Cristianos: Alma Y Guía De La
Comunidad

Lo que leemos en la Biblia de Moisés, de los profetas, también sucede hoy en muchas partes de América. Hay comunidades, Iglesias, Obispos, que pueden llamarse proféticos. A veces todo parece muerto y sin esperanza, pero si miramos con más atención, nos damos cuenta que Dios no ha abandonado al mundo, y que suscita aquí y allá comunidades y hombres de Iglesia proféticos. El profeta Cristiano es un guía. Si leemos el Exodo, vemos que Moisés era el guía de su pueblo, y en toda la historia de Israel vemos que de tanto en tanto aparecen estos guías del pueblo. Recuerdan que Dios es esencialmente el liberador, que se sirve de estas personas y de estas circunstancias para hacer visible su acción liberadora.

Hoy la Iglesia no quiere sólo enseñar el catecismo y celebrar el culto; se preocupa también de los que no tienen tierra, de los que no tienen trabajo, de los que no tienen casa, de los problemas concretos. Y no sólo los sacerdotes, sino los cristianos comunes, por lo menos los que han tomado conciencia de todo lo que significa ser Cristiano. Incluso se debería procurar que los sacerdotes pasen a un segundo plano en esto, y que sean sacerdotes, y los Obispos no son sólo maestros que se sientan en una mesa y enseñan, sino que también se mezclan con sus comunidades y participantes en el compromiso común.

La aspiración de Jesús, de cambiar una Sociedad de lobos en una Sociedad de hermanos que viven unidos, es muy ambiciosa, y si miramos al mundo como va, parece una utopía. San Pablo no sabe encontrar otra expresión para describir este ideal de Jesús que recurriendo a la imagen de un solo

cuerpo donde hay muchos miembros, pero todos unidos entre ellos y coordinados de tal modo, que uno colabora al bien de los otros. ¿Cuántos siglos serán necesarios para llegar a esto? El trabajo es tan difícil que buscamos distraernos y escoger uno más fácil. Nos conformamos con las prácticas religiosas, con ser bueno, lo que es en el fondo más fácil que tomar en serio la gran responsabilidad que Cristo confió a sus discípulos, la de colaborar en la reconciliación y en la fraternidad entre los hombres.

En el mundo en que vivimos, es fácil advertir una labor contraria a esta fraternidad. Las injusticias, las explotaciones del hombre, sobre todo aquí en América, son visibles a todos. Pero el profeta es aquel que descubre toda esta injusticia y la denuncia, la grita. Tenemos en la Biblia muchos ejemplos; citemos algunos entre tantos: “El ayuno que quiero es éste: romped las cadenas injustas, quitad los yugos a los siervos, enviad libres a los oprimidos”... (Is.58). si los profetas se limitaran a gritar, el mundo continuaría por el mismo camino, los injustos dirían: Grita cuanto quieras, a nosotros qué nos importa. Pero el profeta también anima a las comunidades, al pueblo, defiende sus derechos, lo moviliza, y por eso el profeta a menudo es acusado de subversivo.

La fe las mantiene en las motivaciones verdaderas, evangélicas, de acción, y las hace vigilantes, porque se parte con Buena intención y se puede terminar hacienda de los demás un instrumento, una cosa. Por eso el profeta Cristiano se distingue del simple militante político.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

When was the last time you were “astonished” and “amazed”? Parents might point to the birth of their child. Space enthusiasts might recall Neil Armstrong’s walk on the moon. Perhaps we felt that sense of amazement the first time we saw the Grand Canyon or another natural wonder. For the people of Capernaum, Jesus had that effect. He taught with authority. He commanded an unclean spirit. In our modern society with the constant bombardment of news and social media, it can be easy to become numb to the wonder that surrounds us. Perhaps we think we’ve seen it all. Even Jesus and the words that turned ordinary people into extraordinary disciples of the early Church can be something we take for granted or only think about for 20 minutes on Sunday. Our Gospel challenges us to quiet the noise, and Paul encourages us to seek “adherence to the Lord without distraction.” Let us pray that the Lord rekindles our faith, so that we may hear his words again as if for the first time and engage ourselves anew in living according to his teachings.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

It is very hard to keep exciting news to ourselves. We have an innate desire to share important information and extraordinary events with those whom we love. It could be the call to parents to announce an engagement. Or perhaps telling a friend that you have landed a job or been accepted to college. While these milestones are significant, they pale in comparison to what Jesus has done for us. Through him, we have experienced God’s love, mercy, and redemption, not to mention the direction and means to attain a good life: on earth and with him forever in heaven. Why not share that Good News as well? We don’t have to stand on a street corner to be effective. We can simply let our faith lives enter our conversations, just as our work and other interests do. It could be as simple as, “our priest said something Sunday that really stuck with me,” or “I just finished a remarkable book about Dorothy Day.” As we begin to talk about our faith and listen to others share their insights, we not only grow closer to one another, but can grow in faith together.

WITNESS Today’s psalm struck a chord: “If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.” Next Sunday, make a conscious effort to listen to the readings and music with an open heart (and ears). If something strikes you, consider sharing that with others – be it around the dinner table, on a walk with friends, or during a video call.

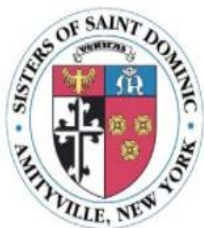
