Public Masses have resumed at St. Brigid's as indicated in the schedule inside this bulletin and on the parish website (saintbrigid.net).

Call the Parish Office (516-334-0021 x 0) to arrange for Baptisms, Weddings and Memorial Masses. Otherwise, all meetings and events (other than virtual) at St. Brigid's Church are canceled until further notice.

The St. Brigid Parish Center at St. Anthony Hall is located at 85 Post Avenue, diagonally across the street from the Church.

Confession

The sacrament of reconciliation is offered in the Church from 4pm to 5pm on Saturdays, and on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays after the 12:10 pm Mass (when there are no holidays).

Visitors are asked to enter the Church by way of the handicapped doors (doors nearest the cemetery) using your elbow to access the automatic door openers. Once inside the Church, those desiring to receive the sacrament are asked to stand on the side aisle standing on the appropriate marks on the aisle that maintain the safe 6 foot distance between penitents.

Due to the Covid 19 restrictions, these hours are subject to change, please check the website for updates.

Sacramental Life of our Parish

Baptism for children (*under the age of 7*) is celebrated in English on the first three Sundays at 1 pm; in Spanish on the last Sunday of the month at 1 pm; in Kreyol on the 3rd Saturday at 1 pm. Parents attend a preparation session on the first Monday of the month from 8 to 9:30 pm in the church. Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) to make arrangements to speak to one of our priests or deacons about your child's upcoming baptism.

Celebration of Marriage

Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) at least six months in advance to make arrangements for an interview with one of our parish deacons or priests who will meet with the engaged couple, set the time and date of the wedding, and make arrangements for our parish marriage preparation program.

Rite of Christian Initiation

Adults who have never been baptized are prepared for the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) through the RCIA process. Other adults may have already been baptized, but are seeking to receive Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Those interested in knowing more about the process of becoming a full member of the Catholic Church are invited to call Sister Ann Horn at 516-334-0021, ext. 353. Parents who have school-aged children who have never been baptized are also invited to speak to Sister Ann about their process of preparation for these sacraments.

Sacraments of School Age Children

Our parish faith formation program prepares children for the celebration of the sacraments of Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation. The norm is that children receive a two-year preparation for Reconciliation and Eucharist (normally celebrated in the second grade) and a two-year preparation program for Confirmation (normally celebrated in the eighth grade). Our religious education program deepens the experience of faith and religious formation in the years between the celebrations of these sacraments.

Parents who have children older than first grade and are seeking to have them receive the sacraments of Eucharist (First Communion), Reconciliation or Confirmation are asked to call the Religious Education office.

Communion to the Sick and Homebound

Anyone who is not able to attend Mass because of frailty, chronic or temporary illness, or admission to hospice can have Holy Communion brought to them at home on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to make arrangements for a lay minister to bring holy communion.

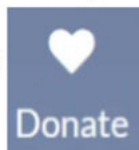

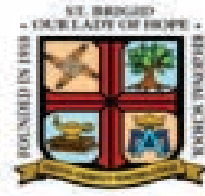

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

June 13th - Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds:

"This is how it is with the kingdom of God;
it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land
and would sleep and rise night and day
and through it all the seed would sprout and grow,
he knows not how.

Of its own accord the land yields fruit,
first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear.
And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once,
for the harvest has come."

He said,

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God,
or what parable can we use for it?

It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground,
is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth.

But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants
and puts forth large branches,
so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

With many such parables

he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it.

Without parables he did not speak to them,



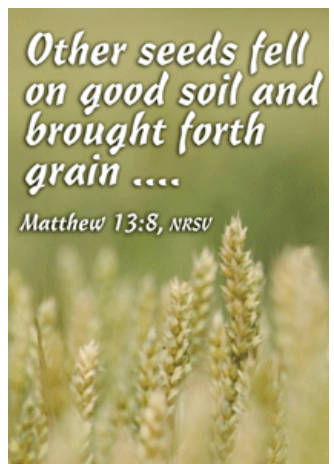
Seeding and growing plants is something that requires our attention, but the actual growing is beyond our power. Here, Jesus is reminding us that the end is not predicted by the start. Everyone can grow in surprising ways, everyone can change. It is God who makes all things grow, sometimes in new and surprising ways, so our current problems should never be an excuse for embracing the future and all of its possibilities. Even if what we think is God's way forward seems blocked, we can trust that God has a hundred ways. Today it is only for us to seek and to find—to discern. God will do the growing.

Gospel Reflection Questions

- What around you speaks of the mystery of growth?
- Think of a small thing in your life that has become a big or important thing.

Some Questions for Families & Children

- Have you ever planted seeds? What happened?
- Think of how God's kingdom grows in our world today.

Welcome Father Raj our new associate pastor

On June 23, Father Raj will take up a new assignment as associate pastor here at Saint Brigid's. Father Raj comes to us from Saint Anthony's in East Northport where he served there for four years. Before that, Father Raj worked in two parishes in the archdiocese of New York - Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton in Scrub Oaks (for 23 years), and Saint Benedict's in the Bronx (2 years).

Before coming to the United States, he served as a pastor, a communication director and a manager of schools in India (state of Tamil Nadu). Needless to say, he brings a wealth of experience and pastoral zeal with his 43 years of priestly service.

These are some of the thoughts that Father Raj expresses in his words: "I am very excited to come to your parish. I did speak to many friends about my going to St Brigid. I heard these pleasing words "Beautiful church, great pastor, wonderful people." My name is too long. Call me Fr. Raj (Kulandairajan Savarimuthu).

I try to follow Saint Mother Teresa in living a simple life and in helping people and children. I do believe in the importance of children's Liturgy and will try to make liturgy simple, prayerful, spicy and involved. In Saint Brigid's I am hoping that for a few months I can observe and learn and help. I love to say Mass, hear confessions and other sacraments. My goal is to bring more people to church and the sacraments."

A number of years ago, I became acquainted with a good man by the name of Charlie who owned and operated a hot dog truck nearby. No matter what you might think of food vendor trucks, Charlie had an outstanding philosophy that should be well heeded by anyone in the food-service industry. Charlie would say that when a customer made any request, the proper answer ought always to be, "It would be my pleasure." Charlie said that the usual and polite response that most people might give to any request is "no problem." But he contended that by saying "no problem," it really becomes a problem in time and would eventually lead to one becoming disgruntled and annoyed when future requests came down the pike. On the other hand, to say, "It would be my pleasure," eventually draws you into the feeling of joy and gratitude to have the opportunity to make someone's life a little bit better.

On the night before he died, Jesus and his closest friends are joined together to celebrate the traditional Passover meal. In Luke's gospel, Jesus says, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer." Why the eagerness? How Jesus wanted his disciples to know that He was not merely the victim of the jealousy of the Pharisees or the victim of the fear-filled Sanhedrin who were more interested in protecting their own self-interest than serving the needs of justice. Jesus wanted the disciples to know that what they would soon witness the following day was an act of love - an act of self-offering. "It would be my pleasure to give you my life, my body, my blood for the sake of your redemption."

And so, Jesus gives his disciples not just a ritual, "Do this in memory of me." He gives himself - he gives his very power to be able to enter into every moment of life, the huge moments of heroic sacrifice as well as the more mundane moments of the ordinary going out of our way for someone. He wanted to give the disciples a power that they could offer meaning to every act of sacrifice with the attitude, "It would be my pleasure."

On this feastday of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ, we come to celebrate the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist - the real power that is in the host - a real power that can help me in the process of conversion to shake off the "no-problem" attitude that, unchecked, can easily lead to the self-pitying martyr complex that does not offer anyone true and lasting consolation. In today's gospel, Jesus tells the apostles to get things ready for the Passover meal. Jesus indicates that the room where the meal will take place is "spacious and furnished and ready." On a deeper level, Jesus is asking us that our hearts be "spacious and furnished and ready," that we enter into this sacramental moment with the anticipation that the real presence of Jesus in this meal has the power to transform us, that our own hearts can be open to making every act of sacrificial love an act that comes not out of duty but out of joy.

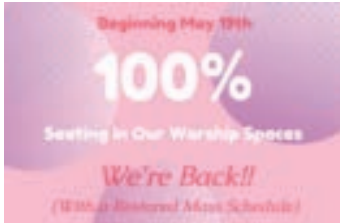

We're Back!



We recently received word from the Diocese that beginning May 19th, 100% of our worship space may be occupied! With that good news, we at Saint Brigid's would like to resume, as best as we can, our pre-Covid worship schedule, while continuing to maintain policies that will keep our worship experience safe during these challenging times.

Here are the highlights of our applications of these directives from our diocese:

- Beginning May 19th, the bands marking off every other row will be removed in the Church. Seating in the auditorium and chapel will also accommodate more people. HOWEVER, we ask that we keep a safe and reasonable distance from people who are not part of your cohort (family). While the CDC has debated the "six-foot distance" rule, we know that people will use common sense not to be near to people who are not part of your household.
- Masks are required to be worn at all times while in the Church/Chapel/School Auditorium. We encourage all to sanitize their hands once entering the worship space.
- Other Covid protocols will continue -- we will not receive communion from the chalice and there will not be holy water in the fonts; however, blessed holy water is available in the large steel containers in the Church and Chapel. Bathrooms and other frequently touched surfaces will be regularly sanitized.
- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation Masses remains in effect.

Fiesta De Corpus Christi El Pan De La Familia De Dios.

la Eucaristía es el centro de la misión de Jesús en la tierra, y la razón de ser de nuestro encuentro, en este momento, como cristianos: misteriosamente están aquí su vida, su muerte y resurrección. Jesús vino para hacer de nosotros divididos, enemigos, competitivos, una familia de gente que se quiere, que viven unidos. Qué nos divide, sobre todo, en el plano social e internacional? La distribución injusta de riquezas: el petróleo, el cacao, el cobre, el hierro, el trigo... todos estos elementos dispersos por el mundo, desde el petróleo de Venezuela al cobre de Chile, están representados aquí por el pan y el vino, fruto de la tierra y del trabajo.

Toda la tierra se hace simbólicamente presente en la Eucaristía. El pan y el vino representan la tierra, los elementos de la tierra; son una partícula de todo aquello que está disperso en el mundo. Por culpa nuestra, este pan y el vino son causa de división y de litigio. Y Jesús precisamente hace de este pan y este vino transformados en su cuerpo y en su sangre, medio de comunión de amor entre nosotros.

Las cosas de la tierra dividen, excomulgan y alejan a los unos de los otros. Por estas mismas cosas, transformadas en el Cuerpo del Señor, nos unen, nos hacen una comunión.

La Eucaristía es la mayor alabanza al Padre pues en ella todos nos comprometemos a hacer comunión. El Padre ve ahí una fuerza que poco a poco nos unirá, una fuerza que acabará por triunfar sobre todas las divisiones, las explotaciones, las servidumbres, las dependencias,...

La segunda cosa importante es que esta unión no se cumple solamente en el plano psicológico o espiritual; debe ser también material, socio-económico,

siguiendo el simbolismo de los bienes de la tierra presentes en la Eucaristía. En el momento de la comunión intercambiamos el abrazo de paz. Es realmente sincero este abrazo? A nivel psicológico y espiritual sí, aunque se abracen dos personas con contrastes sociales y económicos: entre los dos, Jesús es un vínculo espiritual. Pero este abrazo de comunión no llega al nivel económico, material: uno vuelve a su casa donde no falta nada y aún hay lo superfluo; el otro va a su casa donde falta de todo. Hay una dimensión en la cual estas dos personas aún no están unidas: lo que las divide son los bienes de la tierra.

Si Jesús hubiese querido que nos uniésemos solo en el plano afectivo y espiritual, y que ya así nos consideráramos como hermanos, no habría puesto sobre la mesa eucarística los productos de la tierra, aquello que nos divide, para transformarlo en lo que nos une: lo divisivo se convierte en unificador. Por eso podemos decir en la Eucaristía: abrácese, pero vuestra Amistad, vuestro encuentro, aún no es eucarístico, aún no es plena alabanza del Padre. Para hacerlo eucarístico debes descender al nivel socio-económico, y hacer un serio examen de conciencia para ver claro si uso que hago de estos bienes, aumenta la comunión o la división.

La Eucaristía nos compromete a luchar para que estos bienes de la tierra sean distribuidos mejor y se hagan eucarísticos es decir, en medios y vehículos de comunión.
