## **Sacramental Life of our Parish**

**Baptism for children** (*under the age of 7*) is celebrated in English on the first three Sundays at 1 pm; in Spanish on the last Sunday of the month at 1 pm; in Kreyol on the 3rd Saturday at 1 pm. Parents attend a preparation session on the first Monday of the month from 8 to 9:30 pm in the church. Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) to make arrangements to speak to one of our priests or deacons about your child's upcoming baptism.

### **Celebration of Marriage**

Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) at least six months in advance to make arrangements for an interview with one of our parish deacons or priests who will meet with the engaged couple, set the time and date of the wedding, and make arrangements for our parish marriage preparation program.

### **Rite of Christian Initiation**

Adults who have never been baptized are prepared for the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) through the RCIA process. Other adults may have already been baptized, but are seeking to receive Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Those interested in knowing more about the process of becoming a full member of the Catholic Church are invited to call Sister Ann Horn at 516-334-0021, ext. 353. Parents who have school-aged children who have never been baptized are also invited to speak to Sister Ann about their process of preparation for these sacraments.

### **Sacraments of School Age Children**

Our parish faith formation program prepares children for the celebration of the sacraments of Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation. The norm is that children receive a two-year preparation for Reconciliation and Eucharist (normally celebrated in the second grade) and a two-year preparation program for Confirmation (normally celebrated in the eighth grade). Our religious education program deepens the experience of faith and religious formation in the years between the celebrations of these sacraments.

Parents who have children older than first grade and are seeking to have them receive the sacraments of Eucharist (First Communion), Reconciliation or Confirmation are asked to call the Religious Education office.

### **Communion to the Sick and Homebound**

Anyone who is not able to attend Mass because of frailty, chronic or temporary illness, or admission to hospice can have Holy Communion brought to them at home on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to make arrangements for a lay minister to bring holy communion.

# Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

## January 30th - Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 4:21-30

Jesus began speaking in the synagogue, saying:

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

And all spoke highly of him

and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth.

They also asked, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?"

He said to them, "Surely you will quote me this proverb,

'Physician, cure yourself,' and say,

'Do here in your native place

the things that we heard were done in Capernaum.'"

And he said, "Amen, I say to you,

no prophet is accepted in his own native place.

Indeed, I tell you,

there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah

when the sky was closed for three and a half years

and a severe famine spread over the entire land.

It was to none of these that Elijah was sent,

but only to a widow in Zarephath in the land of Sidon.

Again, there were many lepers in Israel

during the time of Elisha the prophet;

yet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian."

When the people in the synagogue heard this,

they were all filled with fury.

They rose up, drove him out of the town,

and led him to the brow of the hill

on which their town had been built,

to hurl him down headlong.

But Jesus passed through the midst of them and went away.



God is with us in our everyday life. We do not always recognize His presence. The real power in being spiritual, is to allow the spirit to move us into the task of doing what needs to be accomplished and in seeing God's work around us. When we allow God to work through us, then we are true followers of Jesus and His teachings.

## Gospel Reflection Questions

- Think of something that may have changed your image of God.
- Think of things that God has done in your life that made you aware of His presence.

## Some Questions for Families & Children

- Think of people you know who are very good, generous and loving.
- Think of people you know who are not believers in God. What can you do to help them believe?

To all parish volunteers

Did Jesus read the Bible? The short answer is probably not - not if you picture Jesus sitting at his bedside, lamp lit, thumbing through a bound volume of pages in a single collection. That single collection of seventy-two separate books that make up the Bible did not come about for centuries after the death of Jesus. What existed in his time were sacred scrolls, painstakingly copied and preserved in synagogues. The Word of God was not so much a book that you would read like a mystery novel from beginning to end; it was an event, proclaimed in synagogues, memorized by scribes, taught by rabbis, and etched into the heart of all believers.

In today's gospel, Jesus is in the synagogue in Nazareth where he grew up. He is handed a scroll that contains the writings of the prophet Isaiah. His eyes search the scroll as he unrolls it and the words of the prophet jump off the page - words that confirm what he himself feels is in his heart - words that reinforce an interior voice that he believes comes from the Father: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, for he has anointed me. . ." Jesus hears these words as having authority over his life and mission - that he will be the one to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind. Rolling up the scroll he proclaims, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Today the Church celebrates "Word of God Sunday," a feast that was proclaimed by Pope Francis a little over two years ago. The purpose of the special feast is, in Francis' words, "Devoting a specific Sunday to the Word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word." As we look at today's gospel and at the feast we are invited to celebrate, allow me to explore how we ourselves might read the Bible.

First of all, I am not particularly a fan of simply reading the Bible from cover to cover, especially if you are unfamiliar with the historical context in which the words are written. However, if you are interested in doing a "cover-to-cover" reading of the Bible, may I suggest that you explore the wonderful podcasts that are done by Father Mike Schmitz "The Bible in a Year." You can access these fifteen-minute podcasts by googling "Podcasts The Bible in a Year Mike Schmitz"

Another way of allowing the word of God to encounter you is simply to do what Jesus did - be "handed" the word of God for this day (Daily biblical readings can be accessed through our website at the bottom of the home page) and allow your heart to be drawn to a particular phrase in the daily reading. Let your heart rest on that phrase and ask simple questions such as, "What does my heart feel when I encounter this phrase?" "How do I want to respond to the Lord as a result of what he speaks to my heart?" "What is the Lord directing me to do?"



# Outreach

## Challenges Bring New Opportunities

With yet another COVID-19 surge in our midst, we seem to be left to feel that we are falling behind, instead of moving forward. It is worth re-viewing not just the negatives of the past two years, but the positives. All of us have had to respond to the challenges presented to us. We can find great comfort in realizing some benefits that have emerged because of each of our resilience to face what we've had to face.

Here in Parish Outreach are a few that come to mind:

- **Food Pantry Ordering System** – Before the COVID shutdown, our food pantry guests were invited into the pantry to choose the items they wanted. We call this a pantry of choice. This is very important because it respects the dignity of the person. They are not just handed a bag of food. With COVID, we could no longer have our guests in the building. From this challenge emerged our food ordering system. Our guests now place their orders by phone or via the Internet. Guests get to choose what they want and need and we use our food donations in the best possible way.
- **Gift Cards** - In the last two holiday seasons we were forced to change our holiday collections for those in need. With less volunteers and the difficulties people had in shopping, we moved to collecting gift cards for supermarkets and other stores. This has given our guests the flexibility to choose what they need. Not everyone likes turkey! We are happy to say that this past holiday season, we collected over \$20,000 in gift cards! Your generosity will allow us to continue helping people in this way at Easter and throughout the year. Thank you!!!!
- **Community Connections** – The challenges of the pandemic have given us the opportunity to connect with other community and government organizations. We were able to help people get

vaccines and become educated about a variety of health challenges. These connections will allow us to provide additional services to those in need with the help of our new partners.

These are only a few of the things that we can point to that have emerged during these challenging times. We hope they inspire each person reading this to realize the positives that have emerged in their own situations. Indeed, we are people of hope. With God's help, new life always emerges.

Con menos voluntarios y las dificultades que tenía la gente para ir de compras, cambiamos recogiendo tarjetas de regalo para supermercados y otras tiendas. Esto ha dado a nuestros huéspedes la flexibilidad para elegir lo que necesitan. ¡No a todos les gusta el pavo! Estamos felices de decir que en esta pasada temporada festiva, ¡recaudamos más de \$20,000 en tarjetas de regalo! # Comunidad Hispana de Santa Brigida

## **Domingo Tercero Del Tiepo Ordinario. Ciclo C. Cristo Es La Buena Noticia.**

EN ESTE Evangelio la iglesia quiere que reflexionemos sobre la Buena Nueva que Cristo vino a traernos. Para ello nos presenta el discurso de Jesús en la sinagoga de Nazareth, uno de los primeros de su vida pública, y en cierta manera programático de esta Buena Nueva.

En primer lugar la Buena Nueva está dirigida a los pobres. En esto Jesús retoma las mismas palabras de Isaías, profeta del exilio, que proclamaba para los judíos oprimidos en el Exilio la liberación de Dios como ya cercana. Al usar el texto de Isaías en Nazaret, la Buena nueva que Jesús trae precisamente la que esperaba el pueblo deportado, que vivía en su carne el desprecio y la opresión. Para este pueblo -el mundo de los que sufren todo tipo de pobreza- la Buena Nueva es que Cristo viene a establecer el Reino de justicia y de amor, y los signos de esta venida son los que “los ciegos verán, los sordos oirán. los cojos andarán, los presos serán liberados, los afligidos serán consolados, los pobres oirán la Buena Nueva”. la Buena Nueva consiste en que con la venida de Cristo los pobres y oprimidos tienen una Esperanza real de salir de sus servidumbres, de liberarse.

En Segundo lugar la Buena Nueva está dirigida a los pobres de espíritu. (según la enseñanza de San Mateo). Aquí se insiste en las disposiciones del corazón para recibir este Evangelio: desprendimiento y caridad, expresada en el servicio de los pobres y sufrientes. En este sentido la Buena Nueva puede ser recibida, y puede convertir a todos, pobres y ricos, a

condición de que entren en esta pobreza de espíritu proclamada por Jesús en las Bienaventuranzas. La Buena Nueva es tal porque nos libera de toda servidumbre. De las servidumbres interiores, de nuestros pecados, que nos hacen ciegos y egoístas. De las servidumbres externas, que nos deshumanizan y nos dificultan vivir los ideales del Evangelio: la injusticia, la miseria, el erotismo, las opresiones, la riqueza, el poder... Esta liberación de toda servidumbre es la que anuncia Jesús en Nazareth, con los mismo términos de Isaías a los “pobres de Yavé” escla vizados en el Exilio.

Por último, el mensaje de Jesús es una Buena Nueva de reconciliación (“el año de gracia del Señor”). El Reino que El viene a inaugurar no es sólo de justicia (la opresión de los oprimidos y de toda servidumbre humana), sino también de fraternidad, a la cual se llega por la justicia y por el perdón mutuo. La Buena Nueva de reconciliación es que Dios nos perdonó y nos dio la capacidad de perdonarnos mutuamente, para restablecer con el Padre y entre nosotros una fraternidad. Esa es la esencia del Reino de Dios.

Cristo no vino a hacerlo todo El solo. Ciertamente que vino a restablecer el Reino de Dios, pero sólo lo inauguró, dejándonos el trabajo de realizarlo. Constatar la falta de fraternidad es constatar que los cristianos no la irradiamos ni la promovemos. Al anunciar hoy esta Buena Nueva debemos, para no contradecirla, esforzarnos por realizarla entre nosotros.

## **Haitian Commentary, Third Sunday Ordinary Time, C, 2022**

La prophétie d’Isaïe se réalise en lui. Ce qui a été promis devient réalité. Jésus est celui qui accomplit l’Ecriture. Celui qui veut le connaître doit lire l’Ecriture. D’où l’importance pour nous tous de nous familiariser avec les Ecritures.
