## **Sacramental Life of our Parish**

**Baptism for children** (*under the age of 7*) is celebrated in English on the first three Sundays at 1 pm; in Spanish on the last Sunday of the month at 1 pm; in Kreyol on the 3rd Saturday at 1 pm. Parents attend a preparation session on the first Monday of the month from 8 to 9:30 pm in the church. Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) to make arrangements to speak to one of our priests or deacons about your child's upcoming baptism.

### **Celebration of Marriage**

Please call the Parish Center (334-0021) at least six months in advance to make arrangements for an interview with one of our parish deacons or priests who will meet with the engaged couple, set the time and date of the wedding, and make arrangements for our parish marriage preparation program.

### **Rite of Christian Initiation**

Adults who have never been baptized are prepared for the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) through the RCIA process. Other adults may have already been baptized, but are seeking to receive Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Those interested in knowing more about the process of becoming a full member of the Catholic Church are invited to call Sister Ann Horn at 516-334-0021, ext. 353. Parents who have school-aged children who have never been baptized are also invited to speak to Sister Ann about their process of preparation for these sacraments.

### **Sacraments of School Age Children**

Our parish faith formation program prepares children for the celebration of the sacraments of Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation. The norm is that children receive a two-year preparation for Reconciliation and Eucharist (normally celebrated in the second grade) and a two-year preparation program for Confirmation (normally celebrated in the eighth grade). Our religious education program deepens the experience of faith and religious formation in the years between the celebrations of these sacraments.

Parents who have children older than first grade and are seeking to have them receive the sacraments of Eucharist (First Communion), Reconciliation or Confirmation are asked to call the Religious Education office.

### **Communion to the Sick and Homebound**

Anyone who is not able to attend Mass because of frailty, chronic or temporary illness, or admission to hospice can have Holy Communion brought to them at home on a regular basis. Please call the parish office to make arrangements for a lay minister to bring holy communion.

### **Parish Outreach Program**

Our parish outreach program, located in the Father Schaefer Outreach Building, provides a range of social services for people of the local community. # Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

## May 22nd - Sixth Sunday of Easter

### John 14:23

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Whoever loves me will keep my word,  
and my Father will love him,  
and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

Whoever does not love me does not keep my words;  
yet the word you hear is not mine  
but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you.

The Advocate, the Holy Spirit,  
whom the Father will send in my name,  
will teach you everything  
and remind you of all that I told you.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.

Not as the world gives do I give it to you.

Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid.

You heard me tell you,

'I am going away and I will come back to you.'

If you loved me,

you would rejoice that I am going to the Father;  
for the Father is greater than I.

And now I have told you this before it happens,  
so that when it happens you may believe."



God sends the Holy Spirit to us to continue His lifegiving breath in us so that we can move forward with the word of God in our lives. The Holy Spirit will teach and remind us of all that Jesus told us and the peace that Jesus promises us. We pray that our community may see in diversity a gift, rather than a burden.

### *In times of transition, we are called to trust*

A number of months ago, when I announced that I will be leaving Saint Brigid's at the end of June to take on a new assignment, I said that change is difficult - but being the pilgrim people of the Lord, we are always on a journey - nothing is static. Nothing stays the same. You certainly know that in your own family life and it is equally true in the life of a parish. With change comes anxiety - but hopefully that anxiety draws us into a deeper trust in the Lord who loves Saint Brigid's and desires the best for all of us in our future ahead.

So, there will be change that we will experience in June - a new pastor, Father John Sureau who comes to us in his own process of change, leaving a parish that he loves so dearly. There is the change of an associate with Father Raj moving from our parish to go back to this home diocese in India where he will serve as vice-rector and spiritual director of the seminary there. There is the change of Deacon Darrell who is beginning a new life in Florida with his family and will no longer be serving us in pastoral ministry and as vicar for Parish Outreach. Many changes.

And so we are led into prayer -- that moment when we come before the Lord with our hopes and dreams and desires, and place them in his loving hands, opening our heart to a divine heart that listens, comforts and strengthens us in every transition of our life.

"I give you a new commandment: love one another." The whole law, all the commandments, the entire mission of our life can be summed up in that one simple directive: Love. It sounds so simple until you try to consistently apply it to every situation, to every person, to every breathing moment of your life. Love. No exceptions, no exemptions. Love. Of course, our failures to love that are encountered at least in every minute of every hour of every day bring us to the inevitable conclusion that "love" is an ideal, something to aim for but rarely achieved with any degree of consistency. It's like the box of size 32" waist pants that I will bring to my next parish. I hope someday to be able to fit into those pants but the consistent lifestyle I would need to live in order to make that happen is nearly impossible.

But Jesus doesn't give us an ideal to strive for - he issues a commandment: Love one another. I would like to suggest that we read today's gospel in light of the upcoming feast of Pentecost that ends the Easter season. Our tradition speaks about the seven-fold gifts of the spirit: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, fortitude, piety, counsel, fear of the Lord. Those gifts from God are essential if we are going to love others in all circumstances, in all situations. Take for example the gift of understanding. Imagine that I could approach every person in every situation understanding where this person is coming from - their background, their handicaps, the challenges that they have had to face in life. Ask for the gift of understanding - and from a heart that understands, a love that is patient can be exercised.

Let's take the gift of wisdom. Imagine having the ability to weigh all the possible responses I can make towards another person and have the insight and ability to know what to say, what not to say, and how to say it. Or take the gift of courage that will allow me to love in such a way that I say what someone needs to hear - to speak the truth in love. Or take the gift of piety - that I can overcome all resistance to love someone who is difficult because my heart is open to hear God's invitation in this irksome moment. Or take the gift of knowledge, whereby I will know the little steps I need to take in moving my heart from absolute loathing to absolute acceptance. Or take the gift of counsel or right judgment. Here I can avoid the trap of self-serving justifications - convincing myself that I am doing the loving thing when, in fact, I am motivated solely by self-interest. And finally, the gift of "fear of the Lord," allows us to see that we are all in this relationship with the Father who so desires that we work together diligently to achieve harmony and peace.

Now comes the test. Think of a person or a situation right now where it is difficult to show love. What gift of the Holy Spirit should you call upon so that we can better fulfill this commandment of the Lord?

## Domingo V De Pascua. Ciclo C. "El "Signo" De Cristo: Hacernos Hermanos".

Este Evangelio continua en la línea de recordarnos y comunicarnos los dones pascuales, en este caso, la caridad fraternal.

La caridad no es consejo, algo facultativo en el cristianismo. Es "un mandamiento nuevo", tan esencial que es lo que nos hace discípulos de Jesús por sobre cualquier otra característica. Constituye nuestra identidad Cristiana. Ni las prácticas religiosas, ni la asistencia a la Eucaristía, son para Jesús el mandamiento esencial, nuevo. Es la caridad: "la señal por la que conocerán que sois discípulos míos, será que os amáis unos a otros".

La caridad es un mandamiento radical: "Que os améis unos a otros como yo os he amado". Y Cristo nos amó hasta dar la vida por amigos y adversarios. Esta es la novedad del mandamiento nuevo: no se trata sólo de hacer a los demás lo que no te gustaría que nos hicieran a nosotros; o de amar a los que nos quieren, porque eso también lo pueden hacer los no cristianos. El radicalismo del amor Cristiano está en amar como Jesús: perdonar "setenta veces siete". Amar a los adversarios y rogar por ellos, entregarnos al servicio de la justicia y del amor hasta el extremo por ellos, aún hasta el sacrificio de la vida.

Esta caridad que Jesús nos exige supera nuestras fuerzas humanas. Somos demasiados egoístas y cobardes para amar como Jesús amó; nuestra caridad Cristiana no pasa de ser una caricatura. Pero eso es un don. Es un fruto de

la Resurrección del Señor. Como dice un canto religioso: "si nos amamos es porque resucitó" este don pascual necesitamos recibirlo de Cristo frecuentemente, porque nuestro egoísmo es demasiado fuerte, y rápidamente ahoga la caridad. Por eso Jesús nos dejó la Eucaristía, que al renovar sacramentalmente el misterio pascual.

La Pascua y la Eucaristía son la Fuente de la fraternidad humana. Podemos decir que Cristo murió y resucitó para establecer entre los hombres una verdadera fraternidad, que superará las injusticias, los conflictos y los pecados que los dividen. La misión evangelizadora de la Iglesia y de los cristianos consiste en crear fraternidad; cada vez que trabajamos por realizar auténtica fraternidad, el Reino de Dios Avanza, damos un signo de que Cristo ha resucitado.

Esta misión de crear fraternidad es conflictiva, pues se enfrenta con los obstáculos históricos de la fraternidad, que tenemos que eliminar; las desigualdades económicas, los privilegios sociales y culturales, los abusos del poder... mientras todo esto exista entre nosotros, los hombres no pueden "hacerse hermanos". Reconciliarse, vivir la fraternidad. Por eso es un pecado. Es un desafío a la conciencia Cristiana y a la misión de la Iglesia a luchar contra ello, a causa de la exigencia de crear fraternidad, para que el mundo crea que Cristo resucitó.
