THE PASTOR'S POST

A NIGHT OUT

Dear Parish Family:

The parish is where it is at when it comes to the life of the Church. There is definite need for the many other areas and parts of the Church - magisterium, diocese, etc. There is also a clear need for each family - regardless of shape or size -to form what St. John Paul II noted as the "domestic" church or the church at home.

Pope Francis spoke a few years ago and said that the parish must be "a family among families, open to bearing witness in today's world... open to faith, hope and love for the Lord and for those whom he has a preferential love. A home with open doors."

In so many ways, and I have only been here a month and a few days, St. Brigid's seems to be a place that works hard to live out this vision. From prayer and worship, to the diversity of communities to the commitment to form others in the faith to the radical commitment to care for those in need...what a blessing this parish is for many, now including me.

Churches, as I believe Martin Luther King Jr. said though I can't find the quote, should not be places people come in to or remain but places you are sent from. We hear that every time we leave Mass. The priest or deacon says, "Go forth. The Mass is ended" or "Go forth glorifying the Lord by your life." These are not just ways to end Mass. They are commands to mission, to go out and work to bring the Church to all we meet, with a special commitment to the poor and the vulnerable.

This past week, I had the chance to be part of the "going out" as I joined members of Parish Social Ministry participating in the "Westbury Night Out" held at Martin "Bunky" Reid Park in New Cassel. At a time where there seems to be so much division and conflict about, well, everything, this night spoke to something different. It spoke our ability to come together - people of all different races and roles and religions, of different neighborhood and needs, of different occupations and oppressions (we all have them). It was a chance for different organizations and agencies to let those in the community know they want to be places of support and encouragement.



As I walked around, everyone knew about St. Brigid's. Strangers came up to me tell me about how St. Brigid's helped them or a time they were here years ago or the inspiration the parish offered and even some acknowledged they had left the Church and might come back. I don't share this to give everyone an ego boost (but humble gratitude and appreciation is called for). Rather, it is a sign to me of our role not only to build the parish within but also a reminder of the commitment of the Church - especially St. Brigid's - to go out to the local community so all can know this a community of open doors and open hearts!

Indeed, the parish in working within and going out is "where it's at".

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me this week.

A NIGHT OUT

Querido Familia Parroquial:

La parroquia está donde está cuando se trata de la vida de la Iglesia. Hay una clara necesidad de muchas otras áreas y partes de la Iglesia - magisterio, diócesis, etc. También hay una clara necesidad de que cada familia - sin importar su forma o tamaño - forme lo que San Juan Pablo II señaló como la "familia doméstica". "Iglesia o la iglesia en casa."

El Papa Francisco habló hace unos años y dijo que la parroquia debe ser "una familia entre las familias, abierta a dar testimonio en el mundo de hoy... abierta a la fe, a la esperanza y al amor por el Señor y por aquellos a quienes Él tiene un amor preferencial. Un hogar con las puertas abiertas".

De muchas maneras, y solo he estado aquí un mes y unos pocos días, St. Brigid's parece ser un lugar que trabaja duro para vivir esta visión. Desde la oración y el culto, hasta la diversidad de comunidades, hasta el compromiso de formar a otros en la fe hasta el compromiso radical de cuidar a los necesitados... qué bendición es esta parroquia para muchos, ahora incluyéndome a mí.

Las iglesias, como creo que dijo Martin Luther King Jr., aunque no puedo encontrar la cita, no deberían ser lugares a los que la gente entra o permanece, sino lugares desde los que te envían. Oímos eso cada vez que salimos de Misa. El sacerdote o el diácono dice: "Salid. La Misa ha terminado" o "Salid glorificando al Señor con vuestra vida". Estas no son solo formas de terminar la Misa. Son mandatos para la misión, para salir y trabajar para llevar la Iglesia a todos los que nos encontramos,

con un compromiso especial con los pobres y los vulnerables.

La semana pasada, tuve la oportunidad de ser parte de la "salida" cuando me uní a los miembros del Ministerio Social Parroquial que participaban en la "Noche de Westbury" celebrada en Martin "Bunky" Reid Park en New Cassel. En un momento en el que parece haber tanta división y conflicto sobre, bueno, todo, esta noche habló de algo diferente. Hablaba de nuestra capacidad de unirnos: personas de todas las razas, roles y religiones, de diferentes vecindarios y necesidades, de diferentes ocupaciones y opresiones (todos las tenemos). Fue una oportunidad para que diferentes organizaciones y agencias permitan que aquellos en la comunidad que quieren sean lugares de apoyo y aliento.

Mientras caminaba, todos sabían sobre St. Brigid's. Se me acercaron extraños para contarme cómo los ayudó St. Brigid's o una vez que estuvieron aquí hace años o la inspiración que ofreció la parroquia e incluso algunos reconocieron que habían dejado la Iglesia y podrían regresar. No comparto esto para darles a todos un impulso de ego (pero se requiere humilde gratitud y aprecio). Más bien, es una señal para mí de nuestro papel no solo para construir la parroquia interna, sino también un recordatorio del compromiso de la Iglesia, especialmente de Santa Brígida, de salir a la comunidad local para que todos puedan conocer esta comunidad de puertas abiertas y corazones abiertos!

De hecho, la parroquia en el trabajo de entrada y salida está "donde está".

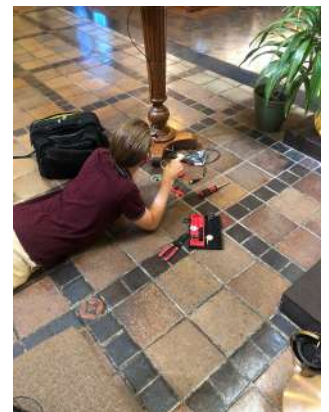

Registration continues for Faith Formation Classes for children in grades 1 through 8, who attend public school. Special attention is given to sacramental preparation of children ages 6 to 18 for Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and Reconciliation. Our classes are scheduled to begin the first week in October.

In Person: St. Brigid Faith Formation Center is located off St. Brigid Lane Parking Lot, 101 Maple Ave. Our August hours are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, 11am to 3pm We will be closed August 15 for a holy day, The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin.

Online Registration: Go to our parish website, www.saintbrigid.net. Click on Faith Formation and then Registration.

Mail In Registration: Families who enrolled their children in our Faith Formation Program for 2021-2022, were mailed a registration form for 2022-2023.

Registering Your Child for the First Time: If this is the first time that your child ever attended a religion program, call us for a mail in form or come to register in person at St. Brigid Faith Formation Center. You would need to include a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate.

Religion Teachers & Hall Monitors Needed: Our program is based on volunteer parents etc. Please seriously consider teaching a class or being a hall monitor.

if the master of the house had known the hour
when the thief was coming,
he would not have let his house be broken into.
You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect,
the Son of Man will come."
