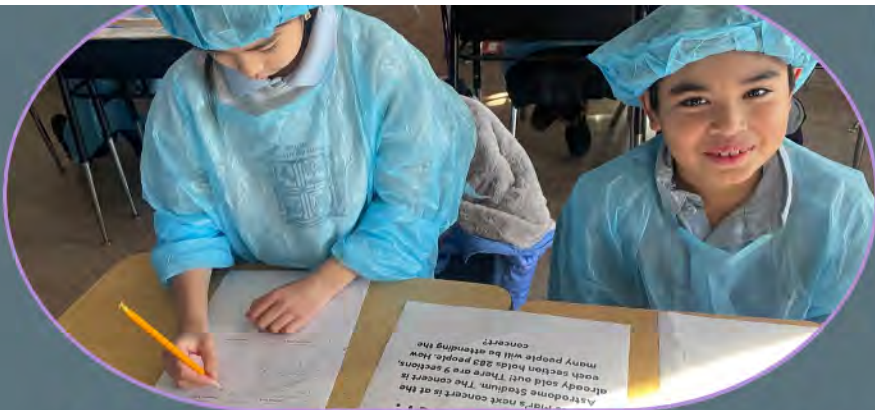
We are offering a fall Woman's Bethany Retreat on Saturday, Sept. 27th.

EL POST DEL PÁRROCO

LA MEMORIA DE DIOS

Querida familia parroquial:

Hace unas semanas, escribí sobre el riesgo que corremos, tanto yo como quizá tú, de volvernos insensibles ante los tiempos difíciles que vivimos. Escribí que, en ocasiones, quizá nos apresuramos demasiado a seguir adelante, en lugar de afrontar todo lo que conlleva un momento difícil.

La semana pasada, Yanira Chacón, nuestra directora del Ministerio Social Parroquial, y yo fuimos en coche a un evento en agradecimiento por una importante subvención que habíamos recibido. Tuvimos tiempo para hablar de todo lo que tanta gente está pasando en este momento y de cómo a veces nos vemos limitados en lo que podemos hacer. Al hablar de un problema al que se enfrentan muchos en nuestra comunidad, ella dijo: «Me pregunto si la gente está aceptando esto, pensando que es normal». Si es así, no habrá deseo ni acción para el cambio.

Después de rezar con las lecturas de este domingo, me pregunto qué nos diría Amós hoy. No tengo el conocimiento de las Escrituras que tiene nuestro nuevo sacerdote residente, el padre Jacob, pero imagino que Amós estaría furioso con nosotros y con nuestra forma de cuidar a los necesitados. Digo «nosotros» porque todos tenemos que mirar más profundamente dentro de nosotros mismos. La última línea de la primera lectura de hoy me impacta. Es la conclusión de un largo discurso que condena al pueblo por aprovecharse de los pobres y los vulnerables.

Vemos grandes avances, grandes bienes potenciales, en el mundo en el que vivimos. Avances en tecnología, por no mencionar la inteligencia artificial, y mucho más. Sí. Cada una de estas cosas «buenas» y otras sin duda requieren discernimiento, sobre todo si queremos que sigan siendo buenas. Al acostumbrarnos a las comodidades y el confort de este mundo, ¿nos hemos acostumbrado también a algunas injusticias, especialmente hacia los pobres y los vulnerables? En lugar de levantarnos, nos doblegamos.

Pensemos en cualquiera de nuestros temas «candentes». Vemos un cambio real en el mundo en el que vivimos en lo que respecta a la moralidad y las acciones sexuales. Se ha perdido la verdad de la enseñanza sobre la sexualidad y la Iglesia ha perdido

credibilidad. Al mismo tiempo, vemos cómo se trata de forma horrible y vehemente a las personas que ven las cosas de manera diferente o actúan de manera diferente en estos ámbitos. Por lo tanto, no trabajamos para abordar el odio o las verdades de nuestra fe. Bueno, es lo que hay.

Vemos un aumento de la violencia en muchos niveles y en muchos lugares. El asesinato de Charlie Kirk es el último de una serie de actos violentos contra líderes que quizá no estén de acuerdo con nosotros o no compartan nuestros valores o nuestro enfoque. En un solo día, el Sr. Kirk perdió la vida, se produjo otro tiroteo en una escuela y la guerra y la violencia se extendieron aún más en Oriente Medio y Ucrania, con miles de personas muertas. ¡Todo en un solo día! ¿Qué vas a hacer? Supongo que esto tendrá que resolverse por sí solo. Rezaré por ello. (Esto es esencial, sin duda. Pero, ¿es suficiente?)

Estamos viendo cómo se separan las familias de nuestros hermanos y hermanas inmigrantes, viendo cómo los que ocupan cargos en la justicia penal se ceban deliberadamente con las personas de piel negra y morena. Muchos de nosotros nos encogemos de hombros. Quizás nos convencemos a nosotros mismos con el tópico de que «ellos» no vinieron aquí de la manera correcta, por lo que... las detenciones basadas en el color de la piel, las horribles condiciones carcelarias y el lenguaje odioso y racista son aceptados e incluso «apreciados» por los católicos. Así son las cosas ahora. ¿Qué podemos hacer?

Y nos conformamos. Evitamos conversaciones difíciles. Apoyamos tácticamente o abiertamente a quienes buscan destruir a otros. No alzamos la voz ni denunciemos cosas que sabemos que están destruyendo la dignidad de otros seres humanos. Casi se convierte en algo normal, aceptado.

No creo que Amos lo aceptara.

Estoy bastante seguro de que Dios tampoco lo hará.

Oremos por un espíritu de inquietud en estos días y tiempos, una inquietud causada por el Evangelio. Desde esa inquietud, oremos por una respuesta santa, una que provenga del discernimiento y el deseo del bien del otro. ¡Que Dios nos ayude!

THE PASTOR'S POST

GOD'S MEMORY

Dear Parish Family:

A few weeks ago, I wrote about the risk for me, and perhaps for you, of becoming numb to the challenging times in which we live. I wrote that, at times perhaps, we're too quick to move on, rather than face all that is involved in a difficult moment.

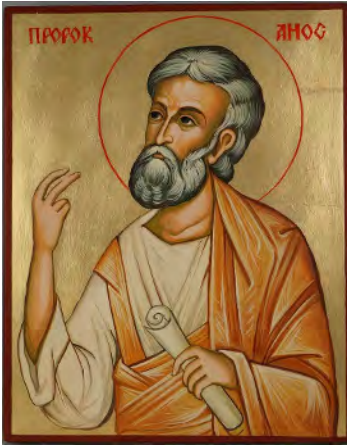
This past week, Yanira Chacon, our Director of Parish Social Ministry, and I drove to an event in gratitude for a significant grant we had received. Having some time, we talked about all that so many are facing right now and how we are sometimes limited in what we are able to do. In discussing an issue many are facing in our community, she said, "I wonder if people are accepting this, thinking this is normal." If so, there will be no desire, no action for change.

After praying with this Sunday's readings, I wonder what Amos would say to us today. I don't have the knowledge about the Scriptures as our new resident priest, Fr. Jacob, has, but I imagine Amos would be livid with us and our care for those in need. I say "us" because we all have to look harder within. The last line of the first reading today strikes me. It is the conclusion of a long discourse condemning the people for taking advantage of the poor and the vulnerable.

We see great advancements, great potential goods, in the world in which we live. Advances in technology, not to mention AI, and so much more. Yes, each of these "good" things and others certainly requires a discernment, particularly if we want these things to remain good. Becoming accustomed to the convenience and comforts of this world, have we become used to some of the injustice, particularly towards the poor and the vulnerable? Instead of standing up, we crunch down.

Think of any of our "hot" topics. We see a real change in the world in which we live regarding sexual morality and actions. The truth of the teaching about sexuality has been lost and the Church has lost

credibility. At the same time, we see people who see things differently or act differently in these areas treated horrendously and vehemently. So we do not work at addressing hatred or the truths of our faith. Well, it is what it is.



We see a rise in violence on so many levels in so many places. The assassination of Charlie Kirk is the latest in a string of acts of violence against leaders who may not agree with us or share our values or approach. In one day, Mr. Kirk's life was taken, there was another school shooting, and war and violence spread further in the Middle East and Ukraine with thousands of people dying. All in one day! What are you going to do? I guess this will need to work itself out. I'll say a prayer. (This is essential, for sure. But is it enough?)

We are watching the families of our immigrant brothers and sisters being torn apart seeing those in criminal justice roles purposely targeting those with black and brown skin. Many of us shrug our shoulders. Maybe convince ourselves with the platitude that "they" didn't come here the right way, so...detentions based on skin color, horrendous prison conditions, and hateful and racist language are accepted and even "liked" by Catholics. This is the way it is now. What can we do?

And we settle. We avoid difficult conversations. We tactically or openly support those who are seeking to destroy others. We fail to speak up or out about things that we know are destroying the dignity of other human beings. It almost becomes normal, accepted.

I don't think Amos would have it.

Pretty sure God won't either.

Let' us pray for a spirit of discomfort in these days and times, a discomfort caused by the Gospel. From that discomfort let us pray for a holy response, one that comes from a place of discernment and desire for the good of the other. God help us!

Please pray for me. I promise the same.

CONVENT UPDATES

As you know, the convent building has now become an expense to the parish and is severely impacting our finances. Marcel Catafago, our Business Manager, Jenny Araujo, one of our parish trustees, and Matt Cahill, chair of our Finance Committee, will now help the parish to select a real estate agent/firm to help with the sale of the property. We hope to be able to announce more about this in October. The decision to sell, as opposed to rent, is a significant one but after much reflection, consultation, and discernment, we believe this will provide the best path forward for the parish.

- In life, do you place your trust and hope in worldly things or in God?"

Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

Jesus told the story about the rich man and Lazarus so that his listeners would repent and put their faith in God. Then they, too, like Lazarus, will rest in the bosom of Abraham.

- When does the rich man show concern for others?
- What is Jesus teaching us in this Parable?
- How does the reality of Heaven help us get through the suffering in our life?
