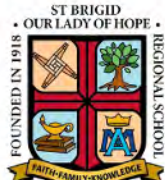

PASTOR'S POST

HAND HOLDING

Dear Parish Family:

This year we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. We do not often celebrate this feast on a Sunday. Most years it is celebrated on the Monday after Epiphany. So we have an extra week of Christmas this year which is a great gift for us.

The first reading today - for Year A of the Baptism of the Lord - is one of my favorite readings in Isaiah. When I celebrate Baptisms, I often use this reading. I love that it is a reminder of our mission but there is an important pre-condition for that mission.

"I have grasped you by the hand" (Isaiah 42:6).

This is the precondition for which we should be grateful and receptive. God wants to hold us by the hand.

A real challenge for me is that often I do not let God hold my hand. I am quick to try to do this on my own - even good things that are clearly in God's plan - without taking enough time for God to hold on to me, to support me, to direct me. Or worse, I can resist the invitation of God to draw nearer to me. That's usually not a sign of me doing good things. Can you see some of the same challenges in your own journey?

Listen to the words of the Father about, not to, the Son in the Gospel today - "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." When I celebrate Baptisms I sort of imagine God saying that about each child in the Church - and the parents and godparents and family members and friends - I love this kid! I am happy. I am with them!

This idea has been in my heart a great deal these days, particularly as we come closer to the end of the Christmas season. If God enters the world, if he becomes "in flesh", what am I, what are we, doing to make sure the presence of our God is at the center of everything we do as

individuals, families, friends, community and parish. Even if I "know" it is what Jesus would call us to do, am I (are we) working hard enough to make that connection - to see God holding our hand - in our decisions, actions, and efforts on behalf of others.

I find it significant that the prophet cites this connection first. We have to remember and recall this God who holds on to us before we take on the work of the Gospel - being a light, setting others free, raising others out of dungeons, feeding the

hungry, forming young people in faith, advocating for the oppressed, working to bring families together, confronting racism, and so much more. It is clear these things are in the Gospel and in the teachings of the Church. Yes! Amen! But do I allow God to be near me in my discernment, my work, my reflection?

As you can see in the pages of the bulletin, we have a lot of things happening. Some are more social. Some involve the transformational education of our school. Others feature celebrations of our community. Others are a call to service, particularly to those who are in need and so much more. As I approach these things this year, I am working harder to see how Jesus is in the middle of all of this, even if it may not appear to be so at first. I know he's there. I just need to focus more on seeing how what we do is coming from my relationship with him so that others may be touched by His presence.

Maybe a good reflection for each of us as we celebrate this Baptism of the Lord. Can I make a suggestion for this to become an image to pray with and reflect upon this week? Hold out your hand. Sit quietly. Imagine God taking your hand into his and just holding it and holding you too.

Hold out your hand. God wants to grasp it. Let Him.

Please pray for me. I promise the same.

EL POST DEL PARROCO

MANO QUE SOSTENGA

Querida familia parroquial:

Este año celebramos la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor. No solemos celebrar esta fiesta en domingo. La mayoría de los años se celebra el lunes después de la Epifanía. Así que este año tenemos una semana extra de Navidad, lo cual es un gran regalo para nosotros.

La primera lectura de hoy, para el año A del Bautismo del Señor, es una de mis lecturas favoritas de Isaías. Cuando celebré bautismos, suelo utilizar esta lectura. Me encanta que sea un recordatorio de nuestra misión, pero hay una condición previa importante para esa misión.

«Te he tomado de la mano» (Isaías 42, 6).

Esta es la condición previa por la que debemos estar muy agradecidos y ser muy receptivos. Dios quiere tomarnos de la mano.

Un verdadero desafío para mí es que a menudo no dejo que Dios me tome de la mano. Me apresuro a intentar hacerlo por mi cuenta, incluso las cosas buenas que están claramente en el plan de Dios, sin tomarme el tiempo suficiente para que Dios me sostenga, me apoye y me guíe. O peor aún, puedo resistirme a la invitación de Dios de acercarme a él. Eso no suele ser una señal de que estoy haciendo cosas buenas. ¿Ves algunos de estos mismos retos en tu propio camino?

Escucha las palabras del Padre sobre el Hijo, no al Hijo, en el Evangelio de hoy: «Este es mi Hijo amado, en quien tengo mis complacencias». Cuando celebré bautismos, clasificó Imaginen a Dios diciendo eso sobre cada niño de la Iglesia, y sobre los padres, padrinos, familiares y amigos: «¡Amo a este niño! ¡Estoy feliz! ¡Estoy con ellos!».

Esta idea ha estado muy presente en mi corazón estos días, especialmente ahora que nos acercamos al final de la temporada navideña. Si Dios entra en el mundo, si se hace «carne», ¿qué estoy haciendo yo, qué estamos haciendo nosotros para asegurarnos de que la presencia de nuestro Dios esté en el centro de todo lo que hacemos como individuos,

familias, amigos, comunidad y parroquia? Aunque «sé» que es lo que Jesús nos pediría que hiciéramos, ¿estoy (estamos) trabajando lo suficiente para establecer esa conexión, para ver a Dios tomándonos de la mano, en nuestras decisiones, acciones y esfuerzos en favor de los demás?

Me parece significativo que el profeta cite primero esta conexión. Tenemos que recordar y evocar a este Dios que nos sostiene antes de emprender la labor del Evangelio: ser luz, liberar a los demás, sacar a otros de las mazmorras, alimentar a los hambrientos, formar a los jóvenes en la fe, defender a los oprimidos, trabajar para reunir a las familias, enfrentarnos al racismo y mucho más. Está claro que estas cosas están en el Evangelio y en las enseñanzas de la Iglesia. ¡Sí! ¡Amén! Pero ¿permite que Dios esté cerca de mí en mi discernimiento, mi trabajo, mi reflexión?

Como pueden ver en las páginas del boletín, tenemos muchas cosas que hacer. Algunas son más sociales. Otras tienen que ver con la educación transformadora de nuestra escuela. Otras son celebraciones de nuestra comunidad. Otras son un llamado al servicio, especialmente a los necesitados, y mucho más. Al abordar estas cosas este año, estoy trabajando más duro para ver cómo Jesús está en medio de todo esto, aunque al principio no lo parezca. Sé que Él está ahí. Solo necesito centrarme más en ver cómo lo que hacemos proviene de mi relación con Él, para que otros puedan sentirse conmovidos por Su presencia.

Quizás sea una buena reflexión para cada uno de nosotros al celebrar este Bautismo del Señor. ¿Puedo sugerir que esto se convierta en una imagen con la que rezar y reflexionar esta semana? Extiende tu mano. Siéntate en silencio. Imagina a Dios tomando tu mano entre las suyas y simplemente sosteniéndola y sosteniéndote a ti también.

Extiende tu mano: Dios quiere tomarla.

Por favor, recen por mí. Yo prometo hacer lo mismo.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

"Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus," greeted the holy people of the Corinthian church with God's grace and peace. He addressed them as "sanctified in Christ Jesus."

- How did Paul describe himself?
- What kind of people were the Corinthians?

Gospel: John 1:29-34

John exclaimed, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." He continued, "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove...I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

- How does John the Baptist identify Jesus?
- What is the difference between John's baptism and Jesus' baptism?
- What does it mean to be baptised with the Holy Spirit?
