THE PASTOR'S POST

SETTLING

Dear Parish Family:

I have a person in my life who is very frustrated with the things of the world these days. Maybe you know someone like this too? Needless to say, she is frustrated with the government - on all levels, and the many despairing situations we are facing in the world. She is profoundly disappointed in the Church, particularly in these days.

As the priest :)! , as you can imagine, I hear quite regularly about her frustrations, particularly with the Church. "Where are they, John?" "Nice statement, no action." "Good video about migrants, so what are you doing about it?" "Racist video from political leaders, where's the Church, John? Where are the prophets?"

I hear her voice and I agree with her to some extent on some of her concerns. Yet, I am uncertain what to do. Write another letter? Send another email? I don't give up. But I'm not sure what to do. So I tend to put my head down and focus on what is before me. I hope that is enough.

I settled.

"What can you do?", I say to myself. I can't fix all of those issues. I will work my best in the part of the world I am sent to. That's enough. Or is it?

As I have been praying with this Sunday's Gospel, I feel called out. Jesus, in referring to the Law, is arguing against settling, right? The Jewish leaders know the written laws. Jesus knows they know. He says during many parts of the reading, "You have heard it was said..." and calls them to go to a deeper place. They spend the rest of the Gospel avoiding that call.

They have settled. We are following the Law. We know it. We hear the Commandments. We follow them.

What is Jesus saying to them? It's not enough.

We may have settled. We say, "Look, I'm

following the law." I know what is allowed and not allowed.

What is Jesus saying to you and to me? It's not enough.

So, this week, as we get ready for Lent, can we look within and admit there are places we have settled. Do we follow the "letter of the law", i.e. "no adultery here", but miss the spirit, i.e. "so I visit a few websites every now and then." Or "I would never hurt another person or take their life", but "I have heard about him or her, I would not want that person in my life." Maybe instead of just looking at the places we sin - a good thing to do regularly - can we look where we have settled. Instead of moving deeper, examine the places we have stayed on the surface.

This, of course, extends beyond our own interior conversion. Have we settled when it comes to "loving our neighbor"? Have I settled for injustice and not done everything I can to bring about change? Maybe I don't speak poorly of those afflicted but do I speak up and act out when I see human beings - from womb to tomb - being disrespected and destroyed? Perhaps, I need to take a more forceful stand when I see evil taken up against others because of their skin color or accent or paper status? Maybe instead of rolling my eyes and saying "what are you going to do" I can in words and actions say, "No. This is wrong."

This sounds good. It's not easy. It wasn't for Jesus or for his disciples. Honestly, sometimes, I don't know where to start. So it's easier to put my head down and get to work. I pray the Lenten journey will help me to keep my head up, following the lead of the Spirit who scrutinizes everything, especially the settled places of my heart (1 Corinthians 2:10). Maybe the same for you too?

Please pray for me. I promise the same.

EL POST DEL PARROCO

ASENTAMIENTO

Estimada familia parroquial:

Hay una persona en mi vida que está muy frustrada con las cosas del mundo hoy en día. ¿Quizás tú también conoces a alguien así? No hace falta decir que está frustrada con el gobierno, en todos los niveles, y con las muchas situaciones desesperadas a las que nos enfrentamos en el mundo. Está profundamente decepcionada con la Iglesia, especialmente en estos días.

Como sacerdote, como te puedes imaginar, escucho con bastante frecuencia sus frustraciones, especialmente con la Iglesia. «¿Dónde están, John?». «Bonitas palabras, pero ninguna acción». «Buen video sobre los migrantes, ¿y qué estás haciendo al respecto?». «Video racista de los líderes políticos, ¿dónde está la Iglesia, John? ¿Dónde están los profetas?».

Escucho su voz y estoy de acuerdo con ella hasta cierto punto en algunas de sus preocupaciones. Sin embargo, no estoy seguro qué hacer. ¿Escribir otra carta? ¿Enviar un correo electrónico? No me rindo. Pero no estoy seguro de qué hacer. Así que tiendo a bajar la cabeza y concentrarme en lo que tengo delante. Espero que sea suficiente.

Me conformo.

«¿Qué puedes hacer?», me digo a mí mismo. No puedo solucionar todos esos problemas. Trabajaré lo mejor posible en la parte del mundo a la que me envíen. Eso es suficiente. ¿O no?

Mientras oraba con el Evangelio de este domingo, me sentí interpelado. Jesús, al referirse a la Ley, está argumentando en contra de conformarse, ¿verdad? Los líderes judíos conocen las leyes escritas. Jesús sabe que las conocen. En muchas partes de la lectura, dice: «Habéis oído que se dijo...» y los llama a ir más allá. Ellos pasan el resto del Evangelio evitando esa llamada.

Se han establecido. Seguimos la Ley. Lo sabemos. Escuchamos los Mandamientos. Los seguimos.

¿Qué les está diciendo Jesús? No es suficiente.

Puede que nos hayamos conformado. Decimos: «Mira, yo cumplo la ley». Sé lo que está permitido y lo que no.

¿Qué nos está diciendo Jesús a ti y a mí? No es suficiente.

Así que, esta semana, mientras nos preparamos para la Cuaresma, ¿podemos mirar dentro de nosotros mismos y admitir que hay aspectos en los que nos hemos acomodado? ¿Seguimos la «letra de la ley», es decir, «no cometerás adulterio», pero nos saltamos el espíritu, es decir, «así que de vez en cuando visito algunas páginas web»? O «nunca haría daño a otra persona ni le quitaría la vida», pero «he oído hablar de él o ella, no querría a esa persona en mi vida». Quizás, en lugar de limitarnos a mirar los aspectos en los que pecamos —algo que es bueno hacer con regularidad—, podamos mirar en qué aspectos nos hemos acomodado. En lugar de profundizar, examinemos los aspectos en los que nos hemos quedado en la superficie.

Esto, por supuesto, va más allá de nuestra propia conversión interior. ¿Nos hemos conformado con «amar a nuestro prójimo»? ¿Me he conformado con la injusticia y no he hecho todo lo posible para lograr un cambio? Quizás no hablo mal de los afligidos, pero ¿alzo la voz y actúo cuando veo que se falta al respeto y se destruye a seres humanos, desde el útero hasta la tumba? ¿Quizás debo adoptar una postura más firme cuando veo que se comete el mal contra otros por el color de su piel, su acento o su situación legal? Quizás, en lugar de poner los ojos en blanco y decir «¿qué le vas a hacer?», puedo decir con palabras y acciones: «No. Esto está mal».

Esto suena bien. No es fácil. No lo fue para Jesús ni para sus discípulos. Sinceramente, a veces no sé por dónde empezar. Así que es más fácil bajar la cabeza y ponerme a trabajar. Rezo para que el camino de Cuaresma me ayude a mantener la cabeza alta, siguiendo la guía del Espíritu que lo escudriña todo, especialmente los rincones más recónditos de mi corazón (1 Corintios 2:10). ¿Quizás a ti te pase lo mismo?

Por favor, recen por mí. Yo prometo hacer lo mismo.

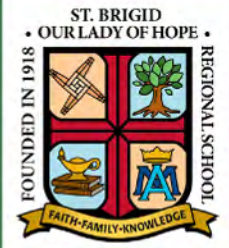

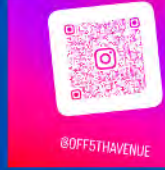

First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7

The Lord God created Adam and Eve and set them in the garden of Eden. They had all they needed, but the serpent tempted them, and they disobeyed God's command.

- Would it be better if we did not have the freedom to choose?
